

Rossahilly, Enniskillen

Better known as the “airport”, this shoreline on Lough Lough Erne is certainly one of the most prolific and consistent bream fisheries in Fermanagh. Rossahilly is a famous fishery on the lower lake with plenty of quality hybrids and roach, plus more than a fair chance of catching bream. The most popular swims are on the “point” (facing the island) where there is a depth of about 14ft when using a groundbait feeder. The best catches are always made when there is a steady onshore wind creating wave cover in the clear water.



Species: Bream, roach, hybrids, pike and perch

Best baits: Worm, maggot and caster.

Popular methods: Feeder fishing is the most effective approach and anyone able to cast 50 metres will generally get the bigger share of fish.

Local tackle shop: Clough Valley Mill. 02866 322008

Access: There is a £5 day ticket that should be paid before fishing at Rossahilly House alongside the drive to the lake shore.

Directions: From Enniskillen take the A32 and then the B82 and follow the airport signs. Access to the shoreline is through a gate at the left end of the car park. If it is closed, speak to the control tower staff in the main airport building.
