

Tessa's Shore on Rosduff Lake, Arva

A cracking section of Lough Gowna that has for the past 30 years consistently produced good sport and mixed nets of bream, roach, hybrids and perch. Go along, choose your favourite fishing method – pole, feeder, straight leger or waggler – and relax in the knowledge that there are lots of fish to be caught. It is well to be aware that from the last week in August and for about three weeks, this shoreline is often used for angling festivals. This stretch adjoins Kevin's Shore on Rosduff.



Species: Bream, roach, hybrids, rudd, tench, pike and perch

Best baits: Maggots will catch everything but take casters, corn and worms

Popular methods: Long pole tackle, waggler and groundbait feeder

Local tackle shop: Greenville House, Main Street, Carrigallen

Access: Access by car is fine in dry conditions

Directions: From Arvagh main street turn into the side road opposite the Bank of Ireland and at the next junction turn LEFT following the sign Aughnacliff. After two miles there is a Y junction with the lake visible in front of you. Turn LEFT and take the first right and follow the lane; after 200 yards there is a farm on the right and a sign Enaghan self-catering. Turn into the farmyard.
